If you were to ask me what is outstanding about the Rico Community Church, I would answer:



We celebrated the first day of Spring here with another blanket of snow. All of us appreciated the quietness of God's creation even through it meant slow driving.

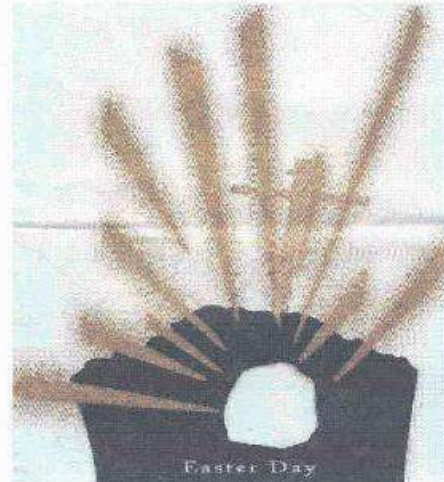
May God continue to bless all of us as we work together in faith.

### Rico Community Church to support a medical mission to Bolivia

We will be collecting items at the church for CARE kits (toiletries, tooth brushes, soaps, washcloths, aspirins, vitamins, baby clothes, etc). The church youth will be packing these CARE kits during Youth night on April 29th.

Sarah, just four months old, performed in her first church play (Moses strikes the rock) this month.

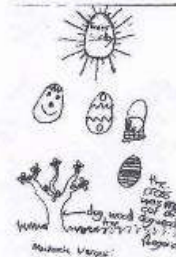


## Youth News
